



INTERVENTION TEAM MEETING

What is it?

A literacy intervention team meeting consists of classroom teachers, special education teachers, Reading Recovery teachers, and principals. The members of the team come together to problem-solve and share responsibility in developing a plan to meet the needs of low-achieving students.

What is the purpose?

Literacy intervention team meetings provide a structure for teachers to collaborate in problem solving around the needs of individual low-achieving students as well as issues concerning early intervention implementation in the school. Topics for a literacy intervention team meeting could include:

- Sharing information about a Reading Recovery or Literacy Group child to problem-solve ways to best support him/her.
- Collaborate on selection of children for Reading Recovery and Literacy Groups.
- Making decisions about discontinuing or continued support for a particular child.
- Reviewing the school's annual report to address areas of concern.
